AN URGENT NEED FOR KINDNESS

SCHOOLS ARE GRAPPLING WITH DEEP CHALLENGES

Chronic student absenteeism has risen sharply.

28% of students were chronically absent in the 2022-23 school year, meaning they missed 10% (~18 days) or more of school.

Teachers are leaving the profession at alarming rates.

Annual teacher attrition reached 10% by the end of the 2021-22 school year, a 4-percentage point increase above pre-pandemic levels.

Shifts in student behavior are making it harder to teach and harder to learn.

In a 2024 RAND survey, approximately two-thirds of teachers said student behavior is making teaching more difficult.



When kindness becomes a shared practice across a school, it can shift the culture—creating a place where students and teachers want to be, even in the face of real challenges.





Launched in 2025, the Kind School Designation provides schools with a roadmap to make kindness a key part of their identity and an opportunity to receive recognition for their school culture work.

Awarded annually, the Kind School Designation will recognize schools that employ empathy to strengthen relationships among students and between students and educators, teach the skills of kindness broadly, and put their learning into action through schoolwide projects and practices.

1. Empathy:


Create a schoolwide definition of kindness created by students and staff

3. Actions:


Implement a schoolwide, studentdriven kindness project or practice
